Christine Meades

Christine Meades, who passed away on the morning of 5 June after collapsing at work earlier in that week, will be sorely missed by Swifts as a club and by a huge number individuals connected with the club.

She first became involved with Swifts when her young daughter, Gemma, became a member and, a few years later, took up the role of club secretary. She remained as secretary, with no thought of giving it up and continuing to work tirelessly on behalf of members, until she died—many years after Gemma had grown up and left the club.

Chris always had time for the members—whether it was to help an injured player, to comfort someone in distress, handing out the sweets to celebrate a victory or console a loss, or to find a partner for someone who wanted to enter a tournament.

She was almost always the first person connected with Swifts that new members came across, and was ever-present at club sessions, home matches and tournaments.

Her funeral on 19 June was attended by a very large number of people indeed, many of them from the badminton world, especially Swifts, and this reflected the love and esteem in which she was held. Several Swifts members, past and present, wore their Swifts shirts as a tribute to Christine and her work.

Her husband and daughter, Alan and Gemma, asked that floral tributes be confined to family members, and requested that, should anyone wish to pay their respects, any donations should be shared between Swifts and Surrey youth badminton.

The Swifts treasurer is administering this fund and the Swifts committee is considering how best to use its share to commemorate Christine's unique contribution.

We are also preparing a book of condolence and will be inviting members, parents and ex-members to sign this before it is presented to Christine's family. The committee would like to express its thanks for all contributions to the fund, and for the many messages of heartfelt condolences that have been received; it is we hoped that we can capture these within the book of condolence.
