Match summary

The U12 mixed A team played a friendly match away to mayflower on Saturday and won comfortably by 155-110.

The U16 boys also played away to Mayflower, in the ACDBL, on Saturday and won convincingly by 210-111.

The U16 girls completed a trio of big wins by defeating Mayflower away by 210-90, helped marginally by an injury to one of the Mayflower players which meant one rubber could not be completed and another was a walkover.

Things were not so rosy on Sunday when we had difficulty finding boys to play for the U12 mixed A team, away to Streetswater B. As a result, Emily Armstrong kindly stepped in to play and, although our team won the fixture by 135-134, we had to concede Emily's rubbers 21-0 (as she isn't a boy) and lost the fixture for league purposes by 70-153.

Club tournament

We held the singles section of the club handicap tournament on Saturday. A record 64 people entered originally, but between Thursday and Saturday several dropped out and we were left with only 57 players on the day. Please read the note on page 2 about this.

This is a tournament in which nobody has anything to lose since anybody who isn't the winner can always blame the organiser for getting the handicaps wrong.

Cliff's rant

We had a record entry for the tournament on Saturday, and our schedules were planned accordingly. However, a huge number of people dropped out between Thursday and Saturday, mostly in mysterious circumstances. Two people did the right thing and emailed or telephoned before the day of the tournament to report they couldn't play for valid reasons such as an injury or an unavoidable family schedule change.

On the day, though, one player was extremely late, claiming to have thought it started at 10am (where they got that from I just don't know); a second was ill but didn't notify us until afterwards; another turned up too early for one of the later starts, went home and didn't bother to return (again, without telling us); a fourth player was believed by his parents not to have been entered (when he had); and three more failed to turn up even though they had entered—and haven't been heard of since.

This is such a collectively poor way to treat a tournament, and discourteous in the extreme to the organisers and other players, that I thought I'd write this piece to explain what is expected of you, as so many don't seem to understand. A lot of time and effort goes into organising our activities and they deserve your respect and full support.

Because so many people didn't turn up, we had a lot of (expensive) court time unused. Had we known in advance that fewer players were going to play we could have planned things differently to take advantage of this time. Reacting to developing circumstances on the day, of course, we couldn't.

So, if you have entered a tournament (or agreed to play in a match) - treat this as a firm commitment and make sure you **turn up at the appointed time to play**. This applies as much to club tournaments as it does to all others, and is doubly important if you have a playing partner.

If you unavoidably change your schedule, are ill or injured, **let the organisers know as soon as possible** and don't wait to be chased.

County representation

Stirling Burrow and Samodani Wijetunge were both chosen to represent Surrey in an U12 invitational doubles tournament in Leicester on Saturday. Both of them were runners-up in their respective events.

Ollie Thompson played in two county matches for the Surrey U13 team this weekend: at home to Avon on Saturday (a win) and away to Sussex (a defeat) on Sunday.

Georgia Flatman played for the Surrey U15 team that narrowly lost away to Avon in the Shires League on Sunday.

Court etiquette

A number of instances of discourtesy to other players were observed at the tournament on Saturday and a reminder of what is expected of you seems to be in order.

Always **shake hands** with your opponents after any match or friendly game, even if you are disappointed that you have lost.

Always **return the shuttle** to the server of the next point if it has landed on your side of the net, and make sure it goes **to** the player and is neither hit **at** him or her, nor merely hit over the net or past the player.

Parents, at matches and tournaments, are expected **not** to communicate with the players during a game, other than to cheer them on. Coaching, help with where to stand, scoring, statements about whether a shuttle was out or in are all **completely forbidden**. Players should try to ignore parents who try to communicate with them in this way, and certainly should not look to them for help.

Players should look for and return all used shuttles to the organisers. They can be used in training sessions and their re-use can save the club a lot of money.

Finally, if you create rubbish around the court, please pick it up and place it in the bin or take it home with you. You cannot expect the match or tournament organiser to clean up after you.

All of these points are covered in the parents' and players' codes of conduct that everyone has been sent upon joining the club (and which can be found on the club website).


