U15 national championships

Samodani Wijetunge (an U12, remember) also played in the tournament and reached the second round of the girls' singles and the quarter-final of the

mixed event. She has also been re-graded as a grade 1 U17 player, so she now holds the rare (possibly unique) distinction of being a grade 1 player in three age groups simultaneously—U13, U15 and U17.

Swifts graded singles tournament

The first weekend of the Swifts graded tournament was held on Saturday. The record number of participants, for a Swifts singles tournament, of 76 players was reduced from the 80 entrants when one player was called in to work unexpectedly, another was ill on the day and two just failed to turn up. Another member, who had not entered, also turned up and had to be sent home, as we can't necessarily grade people and schedule an extra hour or more of court time on the spot.

The graded tournament is a good one as everyone has something to be happy about: those that do well are always happy, and those that do badly can blame the organisers for putting them in the wrong grade. Even those near the bottom of the bottom grade can look forward to gaining a bit more in age and experience, while even the organisers are happy as grading people is much easier than allocating handicaps.

The main object of the grading exercise, close badminton between evenly -matched players, was achieved on the whole and I'm fairly sure, given the entry, nobody was in the wrong grade. The gradings are not allocated until we know who has entered so aren't necessarily comparable from year to year.
