I'd like to take this opportunity to reiterate to all those who ask, every year, how groups are decided that we play to conventional Badminton England rules at Swifts, under which the group member who wins most games becomes the group winner. The first decider is the result of the match between two tied players, and only if that cannot resolve matters do we resort to counting the points scored.

Unfortunately, many people only play in the two Lightwater-based local tournaments where the group winner is decided by the bizarre method of adding up the points they have scored. This system is used in no other tournament I have ever come across and, one day, will lead, to the iniquity and embarrassment of a player who loses all their matches by close margins being declared the winner of a group, or even the tournament.
