Well, the handicap tournament door was firmly closed by the pandemic but another one was opened—the bubble tournament! Because we have not actively recruited new members our membership is quite low at only 80 at the moment. Nevertheless, the turnout this Saturday was proportionally very high at 66 (81.3%, the highest ever for a Swifts singles tournament, despite some late losses due to illness) and our twelve sets of bubblers seemed to enjoy their chance to compete in what I hereby claim as the world's first ever bubble tournament.
