### **Swifts Win Nine ACDBL Titles in 2005-06**

We had an amazing season in the Aldershot and Camberley District Badminton Junior League (ACDBL) again this year with our teams winning three-quarters of the divisions they entered. In fact, eight of our teams won all their matches.

We entered seventeen teams in twelve divisions and won nine of them. Our teams came second in two divisions as well. Obviously, the B teams that were in the same division as the A team could not win their

divisions if the A teams performed as expected.

As a result of this continued success we have reviewed the composition of our entry to the ACDBL and there will be fewer teams this year, but we expect that the teams that have been entered will have closer and more exciting matches to play. This should give better playing experience in order to develop our members.

### **Local Tournament Dates for your Diary**

News is just in of the dates for next season's SSBA and BJBA tournaments. Rally point scoring will be used for all events. The Surrey team tournament is on 21 & 22 April, with an event excluding county squad members (B grade) on Saturday and an A grade (any eligible player can enter) event on Sunday. Swifts will enter teams for both days. An open event can be entered by players from outside the county.

### Club Sessions for the 2006-07 Season

The club session dates have been decided for next season. The first day back (probably handicap) on 7 (singles) and 14 for the new season will be Saturday 9 **September** and the other club sessions

We plan to hold a club tournament (doubles) October, and the club graded tournament will be on 17 (singles) and 31 (doubles) March.

The club session on 16 December will be the Christmas party fun session, as usual.

Please return to the same session you were in at the end of last season unless you have been notified otherwise. There will be a play-in on 2 September to help decide transfers between the sessions and to assess newcomers. But only attend that if you are specifically invited.

### **Getting to Grips with Rally Point Scoring**

If you have some news for the members or would like to write an article about your badminton experiences please get in touch with the Swifts committee (details on page 4)

The International Badminton Federation (IBF) has made a very important change to the laws of badminton-from this season onwards every rally scores a point no matter who served. This is called rally point scoring (RPS). Games will normally be played until one side reaches 21 points, but if the scores are level at 20-20 you must play on until one side establishes a two-point lead or until one side scores 30 points whichever comes first.

There is provision to use the old scoring system but you win the rally. all Badminton England (BE) tournaments, Surrey, Berkshire and Hampshire tournaments will be played under RPS. So, of course will the ACDBL league matches and Surrey league matches.

So, how does the system work in practice?

For singles, nothing much changes except that whoever wins the rally gets a point. So even if you are the receiver, don't forget to

add one to your score when

Things are a bit more complicated to explain in doubles.

For a start, each pair gets only one serve at a time and the partners take turns to serve throughout the game.

But there is no need to worry or puzzle undulyyou will learn all about rally point scoring at a Swifts session right at the beginning of the season

### **Rally Point Scoring in Local Tournaments**

All Surrey tournaments and events will be played using rally point scoring from now on. This includes county matches at all age groups from U11 to veterans and the ICT and ICC. The same applies to Berkshire and Hampshire events as well as the Surrey junior league which Swifts teams play in.

The ACDBL league matches and tournaments will also be staged using rally point scoring. And, of course, the Swifts tournaments will be played with the new system. Page 3

The Surrey league was plagued by cancelled matches this season and some of the tables are pretty meaningless.

No Swifts team ever got to play a Carshalton team and a lot of Wimbledon fixtures were also cancelled.

Swifts teams won the U15 girls outright and tied the U13 girls divisions.

We were only able to get our U18 boys together in sufficient quantities once at the beginning of the season (and even then the team was composed mainly of young players) so the U18 boys' team had to be withdrawn.

In addition the U18 mixed team never actually played because of a strange combination of cancellations.

### **Swifts Success in National Junior Rankings**

Four of our boys are recognised as being at the top of their age groups nationally in the end-of-season national singles rankings, just published by Badminton England.

The star has to be Jack Kinmond who finished the season as the highest ranked U13 in England.

This follows his success at the U13 national championships where he won all three events.

Jack will be flying to

Malmo on 7 September as a member of the England U15 team in an international tournament.

James Buffham was ranked 6th among U16s and 19th among U17s for last season.

He, too, will be playing in the Malmo international tournament, as part of the U17 England team.

**Edward Thomas finished** the season ranked 6th among U14 players and 20th among the U15s.

Edward's doubles partner, Michael Daw finished the season ranked as the 8th best U14 player.

Together, of course, Michael and Edward are one of the best U15 boys' doubles pairs in the country.

All four players have been graded in Badminton England's elite grade 1 for the coming season and will be facing the very toughest competition.

So, boys, the challenge is to do even better this year!

### Other Changes to the Laws of Badminton

Apart from the major changes relating to the scoring system there have been a few other, less obvious, changes to the laws.

First of all the server's racquet head no longer has to be discernibly below the level of the hand at the moment of serving. The new law just insists

on the racquet handle pointing downwards, which could be just a little bit.

This may mean that drive serves become more common.

The shuttle still has to be no higher than the waist higher than the level of the server's bottom rib).

All double hits by a player (whether accidental or not) result in a fault on that player unless the double hit is on frame then strings.

You can no longer pause the service action when the (which is now defined as no racquet is at the end of the backswing.

Jack Kinmond, who this season won the boys' singles and doubles and the mixed doubles at the **U13** national championships and also topped the boys' singles rankings.

Swifts Junior Badminton Club has been teaching young badminton players the fundamentals of the game of badminton for almost 30 years.

From small beginnings we have grown to be one of the largest and wellorganised clubs in the area and currently have around 80 members.

#### **About Swifts Junior Badminton Club**

We feel very strongly that our players should be taught the correct technique from the start, so things like grip, footwork and strokes are shown from the beginning. But we recognise that it should also be fun so we try to blend this with various fun games, for the younger members in particular.

The club recognises that it has a responsibility in teaching the children various social skills as well - how to integrate with other children, how to be a team member, how to interact with adults etc. So by the time they leave us they are good, all-round players.

The club runs two sessions on Saturday mornings throughout the season on six courts at the Lightwater Leisure Centre. The first session, 10am - 11:30am, is aimed at the older children. The second session, 11:30am - 1pm, is for the younger ones. The age range is from 6 to 18 years of age. We encourage (but don't force!) parents to get involved in the coaching if they are players and also welcome help in running the various league or tournament teams or occasionally helping with the committee.

We publish a weekly email newsletter covering our members' competitive activity and also publish Swiftlines several times a year.

We keep all members fully posted on news of local and Surrey tournaments, and those members that are really keen enter national tournaments run by Badminton England and other counties as well.
