With exactly six entrants we judged it better to use the bubble format that we devised for the bubble tournament we held during the pandemic (remember that?) than to simply have three pairs playing one another. This way every competitor plays with every other competitor as a partner twice and against every combination of the other players. At the end of the event one person emerges as winner which is, admittedly, unusual for a doubles tournament but we are nothing if not creative at Swifts. Every game, of course, has to be individually handicapped.
